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

An easier-to-understand life? A newlife? A way of Life? A way....out?" Wrote the Baptist Foreign news.

This is an example of a developing country frustrated with the many unfulfilled hopes. Many people in the country are trying to create a new way of life to seek a way to satisfy the inexplicable yearning and desire of human hearts: through political or and Social reforms. Yet still more people are apathetic to life altogether and try to find a way to escape from the bitter reality.

In the materially prosperous countries like the United States and other countries in the western world. The people have all the material satisfaction; yet they are constantly spending their efforts to beat the ever present boredom and to fill the undeniably vacuum in their lives. Modern technology and advanced science promise a better and happier living for eve ryone, yet we find increasing number of people seek their momentary escape from reality through entertainments of the flesh, sambling, drug and alcohol.

The youths nowaday are utterly unprepared when they are thrown into the highly complex and confusing s ciety of the western world. They are exposed to immoral sex teaching to mounting frustration and to oppressions to many of their desires. Nobody understand them (not even they themselves). They find their present unacce able, the future unthinkable. They are totally disatisfied with life. Down in the very bottom of their hearts there is an incredible loneliness. Life is a horrible bore to them. The youthful voice has to cry out! Some go around and beat up people just to have fun; others race their cars at a dangerous 50 m.p.h. in the city, whistling and shouting just to get the real "kick" of the game; still others who leave their hair long and cry from within their loneliness. "I want to hold your hand !" Out of their boredom of life the youth seeks "Thrills" through alcohol, marijuana, cocaine, opium, heroin and now L.S.D.

"The Escape" runs the name of a bar in America. True enough the bar advertises escape for the hopeless, mainless lives of many!

"L.S.D. ... a new scientific fantasy." This newly discovered research tool spread rapidly and illegaly to many university campuses and soon find application among the highly educated intellectuals ... to find escape in the scientific Utopia. What about the adults? "I simply want to get away from it all! " is the commonly heard exclamation. Get away from what? From the frightening, futile and frustrating reality! Billions of dollars are spent each year for entertainment. People spend money in holiday resorts just to get away from the society they belong. People go to night club, dancing halls, beer parlours, cinema, theatre and race—course to entertain their menses. There is a widely advertised, commonly accepted commodity for sale in this modern age ... free sex. It is not surprising to see along American highways colourful signs printing on them " To please Pizza GIRL." etc. Cinema are places where one can find immorality made vivid.

Great Britian and Canada, no exception. The sex scandals are casually, sacastically and even laughingly talked about as "news" rather than "Shame". "Decency and "morality" seem to be fashioned words used only once upon a time in Britian. Now in Britian, sex is advertised in T. V.; prostitution and veneral diseases are mounting. Nowhere in this world is "Shock-proof" nowaday!

In the countries with less material prosperities people are dissatisfied with their material life. Natural jealousy for those who have mingled with frustration of what they don't have. They want a social change, a change that provide them with material satisfaction. A change that would bring them to equality with the west. They want a new way of life, perhaps, yet like the pensive Brazilian, they are not sure of what they are striving for.

Life is aimless; people are frustrated! Small wonder the society is Chaotic. The mounting criminal cases, the ever increasing racial tension and the mass demonstrations with various ANTI- slogans are so commonly found that one would probably think what man, most nowaday. "Better education for all may change the society as a whole," an educator may suggest. It is the sincere hope of many educators, social workers, psychologists, and other social scientists that through education, social reform, enforcing certain laws and some other means, would bring peace and happiness in the human society. But is it the social structure, the educational system and the like mainly responsible for the resentful, rebellious juvenile delinquents hanging around street corners, the drowsy alcoholic staggering along the road, immorality, riots, racial tension etc..? No, definitely not! It is an individual problem that requires individual solution... it is the basic problem of our own sin. If we condemn the society as sinful and overlook our own sin, we are Blind! If we try to correct the fault of the society while deing nothing to our own sin, our effort is futile! We are treating the symtoms of the disease and not dealing with its cause.


Our sins have severed us from God, and we are liken to a branch cut off from a tree, become dny and die. WE ARE DEAD! This is why our lives are so dry; so empty... dissatisfied and frustrated. Once a missionary said, "What the lost one (sinner) needs is not an improvement of his life, but rather a new life. Except he be born again, he cannot obtain this new life. What we need to solve the problem of our sin is not trying to live a "good" life with our " old selves", b ut rather we need to REPENT our sins and obtain a NEW LIFE through Jesus Christ. We need a change from within our hearts. We NEED Jesus Christ to cleanse us from our sins and give us a new life.

"For the wages of sin is death, and the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord " (Rom. 6:23) Jesus demanded, "but except ye nepent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:5) Friends, are you still staggering along the aimless, hopeless, frustrating, sinful old way of life which lead to perishment? Or do you want to start a new life in Christ, with all the joy and hope of a eternal life?

. "REPENT ye for the kingdom of heaven is at hand," cried John the baptist.

"...except ye REPENT, ye shall all likewise perish," thus preached the Lord Jesus Christ.

"REPENT ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, ... " said Peter.

"...REPENT and turn to God and do work meet for repentance." test-

All of them preached repentance. From their messages and warnings, we see the vital importance of repentance. If we do not repent, we will perish because of our sin, "for the wages of sin is death". However, if we repent, our sins will be blotted out, and we will become acceptable to God. Moreover, not only should we repent, but we should repent NOW, because the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

Yet in this shallow generation, many people have the tendency to neglect the deep meaning of "repentance". Even some preachers might have quoted the word over and over without having a clear concept of its real meaning; others might have avoided the preaching of repentance totally because they fear that people might misunderstand, and consider repentance is "good work", or the "price" for salvation. Hence it is worthwhile for us to search the scripture together for the true meaning of repentance.

It is a common error to consider remorse as equivalent to repentance. But the word "remorse" only means feeling sorry for one's wrong doings. But just feeling sorry will never bring salvation. Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus, also felt sorry for what he had done. "When Judas, His betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, (he was afflicted in mind and troubled for his former folly; and) with remorse, that is, an after care and little more than a selfish dread of the consequences, he brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, saying, I have sinned in betraying innocent blood. They replied, What is that to us? See to that yourself. And casting the pieces of silver forward into the Holy Place of the sanctuary of the temple, he departed, and he went off and hanged himself." (Matt. 27:3-5)

It is evident that Judas never obtained the gift of salvation or else the Lord would not have commented "it had been good for that man if he had not been born." Let us now refer to another verse in the Bible: "For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of; but the sorrow of the world worketh death." (2 Cor. 7:10) The sorrow of Judas was undoubtedly the "sorrow of the world," since he did not turn to God in his sorrow and distress. Let us contrast this with the sorrow of the Corinthians-

"For behold this self same thing, that ye sorrowed after a godly sort, what carefulness it wrought in you, yea, what clearing of yourselves, yea, what indignation, yea what fear, yea, what vehenent desire, yea what zeal, yea, what revenge! In all these things ye have approved yourselves to be clear in this matter." (2 Cor. 7:11) It is such sorrow and remorse which "worketh repentance to salvation." Now, we should see the difference between a godly remorse and repentance. To be remorseful "after a godly sort" is the step leading to repentance. When the Holy Spirit works in a man's heart, he will feel remorseful because of his sins, then he will take a further step to repent. The whole process from remorse to repentance is the manifestation of the work of the Holy Spirit in a man's heart.

There is a change involved in repentance. The word 'repentance' is translated from the Greek word 'metanoia' which has a meaning of change of attitude. J. B. Phillips (author of "Letters to Young Churches") has translated repentance as "a change of heart". Repentance is the complete change of our attitudes toward ourselves, our sins, God and Christ. In the Bible we see how the "perfect and upright" Job after confessed before God that he is 'vile' and 'abhored' himself! We see how Saul who persecuted God's church so ferociously became the Paul who endured all afflictions for the sake of the God whom he had persecuted! We see how the cowardly Peter who thrice denied Christ finally fought the battle for Christ fearlessly till death! Such are the examples of changes in the lives of men. Such are the evidences of repentance. But we must keep in mind that the mere improvement of our behaviour is not repentance, though it is always a fruit of repentance. Improvement of behaviour is only a superficial change that can be achieved by man's effort alone; but repentance is the work of God deep in the hearts of man.

REPENTANCE---this is the message for both Christians and non-Christians today. For those who are bound and grieved by their unpardoned sins and are striving for inward peace, REPENT! Christians, if you are waiting for revival, REPENT!

"Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth." (Luke 15:10)

..... and the Holy Spirit Convicted me.

#### FAREWELL TO DR. AND MRS. HERBERT LEE



# THE GUSTEL HICKOMS

Author: Mark, a Roman, cousin of Barnabas. He was a great helper to Paul

Theme: Jesus Christ, the Son of God is the faithful Servant of man apart from being their Saviour and Redeemer.

"For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45)

Key Words: "Straightway" indicating immediate action. Repeated 40 times throughout the entire book.

Mark was not a disciple of Jesus, neither did he hear from the Lord. According to Papias, the disciple of the apostle John, Mark was attached to and became the interpretor of the apostle Peter and he wrote down from memory the words and deeds of Christ. Mark was also a companion to Paul and Barnabas. At about 44A.D. he went with them on their first missionary journey to Antioch. The Gospel of Mark is the Servant's Gospel of Action. His gospel contains what he had heard from Peter. Unlike the Gospel of Matthew which was written with the Jewish people in mind, Mark seemed to have the Roman gentile readers in mind. Matthew quoted the Old Testament repeatedly, emphasizing that Jesus is the Messiah foretold by the Old Testament prophets. Mark, on the other hand made only one reference to the Old Testament scripture. One of the things that impresses us most as we look through the gospel of Mark, is its brevity. There is no mention of Jesus' conception, birth and youth. It contains fewer of the words of Jesus, fewer parable, but far more miracles and things that Jesus DID than all the other gospels record. In Mark, Christ the Servant is the Working One.

The Gospel of Mark opens with a declaration of the divinity of Jesus Christ, however Mark does not enlarge upon the doctrine. His aim is to let the wonderful works of Jesus testify to His diety. There are nineteen miracles recorded in this short gospel demonstrating the supernatural power of Jesus. There are eight miracles which prove his powers over disease:-

Mark carefully and faithfully put down all he heard from the apostle Peter about what Jesus did during His public ministry, although some of the subject matter recorded in Mark can also be found in the Gospel of Matthew and Luke. It is not mere repetition of the other, for it contains many details not found in either of the others.

There is a continuous, unbroken service of the tireless servant of God and man recorded in this gospel. We read, "And He did this, and He said that." He must teach men; they were in darkness. He must cheer men; they were without hope. He must heal men; they were sick and suffering. He must pardon and cleanse men, because they were sinful.

Seven of Jesus' recorded miracles were performed on the Sabbath. When the Pharisees accused His working on that day, Jesus gave an answer that explains clearly the central principle of Sabbath observance. "The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath." (Mark 2:27) Whatever deed is really helpful to man is proper for the Sabbath, and is in perfect harmony with God's design of the day. This day is "made" to enrich and bless mankind.

Jesus' work was strongly supported by prayers. Time after time he rose early in the morning and went out to the lonely place and prayed. He instructed His disciples to "Watch ye and pray, lost ye enter into temptation. The spirit truly is ready but the flesh is weak." (Mark 14:38) If the Son of God needed to pray before He undertook His work, bow much more should we pray.

Jesus' life was cut off at a prime age. His love for the lost and His sense of urgency had enabled Him to accomplish what God had aportioned to Him within that short span of life. "I must work the works of Him that sent me, while it is day," were His words.

Let us pause for a moment to review carefully how Christ worked. His service was
